


Did you know?

A state law bans the disposal of yard waste in landfills or waste-to-energy facilities, so much of our yard waste goes to large commercial composting facilities.



COMMERICAL COMPOSTING

Food and yard waste are broken down in long rows called windrows creating a nutrient-rich soil amendment called compost.

ANAEROBIC DIGESTION

Food and yard waste are broken down in a digester through a natural process. Renewable natural gas (RNG) is captured and used as an energy resource avoiding greenhouse gas emissions and creating compost, which can be used as a nutrient-rich soil amendment.
